

DAILY HEALTH CHECK

KEY SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS	WHAT TO DO
Fever (above 38°C)	If yes to 1 or more of these symptoms:
Chills	Stay home. Contact a health care provider or call 8-1-1 about your
Cough	symptoms and next steps.
Difficulty breathing	
Loss of sense of smell or taste	
OTHER SYMPTOMS	WHAT TO DO
Sore throat	If yes to 1 symptom:
Loss of appetite	Stay home until you feel better.
Headache	
Body aches	If yes to 2 or more of these symptoms:
Extreme fatigue or tiredness	Stay home for 24 hours. If symptoms don't get better or get worse,
Nausea or vomiting	contact a health care provider or call 8-1-1 about your symptoms and
Diarrhea	next steps.
INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL:	WHAT TO DO
Have you returned from travel outside Canada in the last 14 days?	If yes: Fully vaccinated students, staff and other adults who have travelled outside of Canada may qualify for the fully vaccinated traveller exemption. Students, staff and other adults who are not fully vaccinated and have travelled outside of Canada CANNOT attend school for 14 days after arrival, as part of federal requirements.
CLOSE CONTACT	WHAT TO DO
Have you been notified by public health that you are a close contact of a person confirmed to have COVID-19?	If yes: Follow the instructions provided by Public Health.

You can also check your symptoms with the K-12 Health Check or the BC Self-Assessment Tool.

Call 8-1-1 with any questions about symptoms of illness. If you have severe symptoms, like difficulty breathing (struggling to breathe or you can only speak single words) or chest pain, call 9-1-1 or go to the nearest Emergency Department.

Dear Families, Students and Staff,

Today, the BC Government announced an update to the K-12 education health and safety guidelines to require masks for kindergarten to grade 3 students.

Beginning on Monday, October 4, 2021, all students in the B.C. schools will be required to wear a mask when inside a school building, including while at their desks and on buses. This builds on the existing guidelines that currently apply to all students in grades 4 to 12.

The Quesnel School District is committed to keeping students safe through strong COVID-19 health and safety plans in schools. Over the past two weeks, we have seen increasing numbers of students away from school due to illness. At this time, we have not received any COVID-19 school exposure notices. However, we do know there has been an increase of cases in our community. We will continue to work with Northern Health to ensure that notifications are passed on to the school community in a timely way.

Thank you to everyone for completing the daily health check and staying home when you are sick. School exposures are more likely in communities with lower vaccinate rates and our community vaccination rates continue to be low. Vaccines are the most effective way to reduce the risk of COVID-19 in schools. Everyone eligible is strongly encouraged to be fully vaccinated.

Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA) for all students in Grades 4 and 7

The Ministry of Education, through the BC's School Act, requires that all students in Grades 4 and 7 in B.C. take part in the Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA), an annual assessment of reading comprehension, writing, and numeracy (math) skills.

FSA is B.C.'s earliest provincial indicator of student performance and provides strong evidence of future student achievement. The FSA is a required assessment for grade 4 and 7 students and is the first time a student writes a provincial assessment. This year the FSA is scheduled to run from October 4 – November 12, 2021.

The purpose of the FSA is to:

- provide system level information on student performance;
- provide districts and schools with information on student performance;
- support decision-making (interventions, planning, and resource allocation).

The only exceptions are:

- students who have Individual Education Plans (IEPs) documenting a learning disability that significantly impacts their performance and who cannot participate in the assessment, even with adaptations (eg. extended time, a reader or a scribe);
- students with IEPs who would need such extensive adaptations as to create a hardship for the individual students;
- ESL students who have not yet reached a level of proficiency for them to provide meaningful responses.

Principals determine which students, if any, are excused as per the guidelines above. If it is recommended that your child be excused from one or more components of the FSA, you will be contacted prior to the beginning of the assessment. A parent's submission of a form letter to the Principal will not, of itself, constitute proof of extenuating circumstances.



After hosting several successful youth pickleball clinics this summer, the Quesnel Pickleball Club executive is hoping that there is enough interest in the community to start a junior pickleball club. Here are the details:

- Age 12 to 18 years old. Prior experience playing pickleball is preferred.
- \$30 Junior member fee: a \$10 membership to the Seniors' Centre, valid until December 2022, and \$20 to Quesnel Pickleball Club. This includes membership and liability coverage with Pickleball Canada and Pickleball BC, as the first junior club members in the province.
- Membership renewal would be due in January 2022. **HOWEVER, the QPC will pay the 2022 membership** of up to ten youth members who have shown commitment and wish to continue playing.
- All participants in indoor pickleball activities at the Seniors' Centre MUST provide proof that they are fully vaccinated.
- Members will be provided with access to 'Sign Up Genius' (SUG), an online software tool the club uses to manage sign up.
- A maximum of 12 players will be able to sign up for each indoor session. **Members will pay a \$3 activity fee.** The purchase of a \$30 punch card is encouraged, and provides for 10 + 1 play sessions.
- An adult club member will attend each session to organize play, provide coaching tips and lessons as needed, and ensure that safety protocols are followed. All adults will have passed a criminal record check.
- Junior club members will have the chance to share their passion for pickleball with other youth, meet new people (important since pickleball is a social sport), engage in competitive organized play, participate in workshops and clinics available exclusively for club members, and participate in tournaments.

 Payments of \$30 for memberships or punch cards can be made to the same email address. Please include a statement to say what your payment is covering. Membership payment will be required by the time your child attend his/her second session.
- Junior club play will begin on WEDNESDAY, October 6th at the WFTP courts.
